VOTE "NO" ON PROPOSAL B

INITIATED LEGISLATION TO LEGALIZE THE PRESCRIPTION
OF A LETHAL DOSE OF MEDICATION TO
TERMINALLY ILL, COMPETENT, INFORMED ADULTS
IN ORDER TO COMMIT SUICIDE

Proposal B would:

- 1.) Allow a Michigan resident or certain out-of-state relatives of Michigan residents confirmed by 1 psychiatrist to be mentally competent and 2 physicians to be terminally ill with 6 months or less to live to obtain a lethal dose of medication to end his/her life.
- 2.) Allow physicians, after following required procedures, to prescribe a lethal dose of medication to enable a terminally ill adult to end his/her life.
- 3.) Establish a gubernatorially appointed, publicly-funded oversight committee, exempt from Open Meetings Act and whose records, including confidential medical records, and minutes are exempt from Freedom of Information Act.
- 4.) Create penalties for violating law.

Voters' Guide

Right to Life - Lifespan, Inc. is a non-profit educational and legislative organization. The first informs and motivates people to do something. The second speaks to changing laws. Lifespan can take sides and urge passage of legislation which is called lobbying. Lifespan is not "political." Lifespan does not have a political action committee (PAC) to elect or to defeat candidates.

However, we can publish candidate surveys. This has been clearly permitted on a number of occasions by the U.S. Supreme Court. We can also list office holders and tell you how they have voted on various issues. Such reporting, as we do it, is not "political." Because this comes under Freedom of the Press, such information can be passed out through churches, without jeopardizing their tax status (again by a decision of the U.S. Supreme Court). According to legal terminology, this corporation can engage in "issue advocacy."







Lifespan sent this six-question survey to the following candidates for Governor, U. S. House of Representatives, Michigan State Senate and Michigan House of Representatives:

- 1. Do you SUPPORT the reversal of the U.S. Supreme Court *Roe v. Wade* decision, which allows abortion for any reason, even as a method of birth control, even in the late stages of pregnancy?
- 2. Do you SUPPORT a law banning partial-birth abortions, except to prevent the death of the mother?
- 3. Do you OPPOSE the use of public funds for abortion or abortion referrals, except to prevent the death of the mother?
- 4. Would you SUPPORT legislation that would prohibit fetal experimentation and the use of tissue from aborted babies?
- 5. Do you OPPOSE laws allowing assisted suicide?
- 6. Do you SUPPORT honoring the wishes of patients who want life-saving treatment (including food and water) regardless of their degree of disability, age and "quality of life"?



Shayes-Meehan mistake

The Shayes-Meehan bill is the current effort of our U.S. legislature to achieve "campaign reform." Whatever the merits of such reform may be, this current effort would result in denying any advocacy group, us included, from reporting on, speaking about, or answering questions about any incumbent or candidate (holding or seeking elective office) and his/her views or voting records on pro-life issues.

We would not be able to join in a nationwide effort to ban partial-birth abortion, for instance—there could be no national effort to ban partial-birth abortion because we would be unable to report who favored a ban or who was opposed to a ban. In effect, it would make us unable to let you know where your elected officials stand on pro-life issues.

The U.S. House of Representatives has already passed this legislation. The Senate version of the Shayes-Meehan bill is known as the McCain-Feingold bill. Call your U.S. Senator, TODAY, and ask that he/she protect our 1st Amendment rights by voting against the McCain-Feingold bill.
